#### **PAST MEETINGS**

At the November meeting, **Cameron Semmens** ran a workshop for the first half of the afternoon. Cam invited us to consider different ways of writing poetry and how flexible poetry can be. He encouraged participants to write a Dylan Thomas

Portrait (first line: ask a question, then subsequent lines: write two words only in answer to the question, and the last line: one word only). At the end of the session, participants read out their poems. Cam also invited participants to submit a one line statement of any thought they felt was significant to their life. These were put into a basket, and each person drew out a statement and wrote an Irish Blessing in response. Responses were read out and as the poetry was particularly poignant and uplifting, Janette requested everyone email their Irish Blessing poems to her, so the collection can remain intact.

For the final meeting of Wordsmiths for 2016, everyone brought a plate to share a Christmas lunch at 1pm and after enjoying both food and friendship, the meeting commenced at 2.00 as usual. We also welcomed Jerome Yong to Wordsmiths and Don read a very funny poem titled *Talking Turkeys*, by British poet Benjamin Zephaniah.

**Bron Williams** led the group, and read a piece titled *The Poetry of Christmas* (dated December 23, 2005) by David E Anderson, Senior Editor, Religion News Service. His piece included poetry by various authors over the ages.




